### GCSE EXAMINATION RESULTS 2019

The Hundred of Hoo Academy is immensely pleased to announce that our pupils have secured another year of exceptional results! Across a broad range of subjects, the performance at the highest grades has significantly increased, representing attainment outcomes which are some of the best in the Academy's history.

Outcomes in the Academy's Core subjects have been fantastic! In English 72% of pupils achieved a Grade 4 and above, and 54% a Grade 5 and above. In Mathematics, 69% of pupils achieved Grade 4 and above, and 41% of students achieved Grade 5 and above. An impressive 63% of pupils achieved Grade 4 and above in both English and Mathematics, demonstrating consistent improvement year on year.

In Science pupils are yet again celebrating outstanding results, with 98% of pupils achieving Grade 4 and above in Biology, 87% achieving this measure in Physics and 96% achieving this measure in Chemistry. An impressive 85% achieved Grade 5 and above in Biology.



We are equally proud of our pupils' achievements in our more creative curriculum subjects, 70% of pupils secured above a Grade 4 in Textiles, with 55% securing Grade 5 and above. Photography students secured brilliant outcomes: 92% Grade 4 and above and 60.42% for Grade 5 and above. In Music, 100% of students achieved Grade 6 and above.

It is a privilege to celebrate all of our pupils' achievements and special recognition must go to the following pupils who have demonstrated particular grit, determination and courage:
